It is notified for the information of collectors that so far no special official covers have been issued by the Post Office in connection with the above special post offices and postmarks. All existing covers were prepared either by the respective organisation or by private enterprise.

THE EGYPTIAN POST OFFICE AT JAFFA.

The intention of this article is to supply our members with information and existing documentation about the Egyptian Post Office at Jaffa. The article is based mainly on the research made by the Study Circle of Egypt (1), to whom all credit should be attributed.

As the locality in question is Jaffa, it is worthy to mention that the article forms a part of our description of the Postal History of Palestine.

During the early years of reign of the Khedive ISMAIL (1863-1879) the importance of Egypt in the Mediterranean started to grow, especially because of her naval force and merchant navy. Her commercial connections with Turkey were gradually growing and this was the cause for opening in 1865 Egyptian Post Offices in the Turkish Empire, similar to existing Post Offices of some European powers.

It seems therefore to be quite understandable that all mail between Egypt and the newly opened Egyptian Post Offices in Turkey was conveyed by steamers of the "Khedivial Mail Line". And as the ships of the "Khedivial Mail Line" called also at Jaffa, a Post Office was opened there (on 14th July 1870). The Post Circular relating to the opening of the Office reads (2):

In seguito all'inaugurazione delle linee di navigazione intraprese dai Battelli Postali Khedivie sulla costa della Turchia Europea e della Soria, questa Direzione Generale si affreta a far conoscere i nomi degli scali ove esistono Uffizii Postali distinguendo quelli pei quali possono essere ricevute lettere raccomandate:

Uffizii di semplice distribuzione:

Sira, Lagos, Tenedos, Mettelino, Mersina, Cavala, Scio, Tripoli, Latakia, Gallipoli.

Uffizii che ricevono raccomandate:

Cospoli, Jaffa, Dardanelli, Alessandretta, Smirne, Salonicco, Beyrut, Volo.

Con tale distinta vuolsi sperare essere eliminato ogni dubbio e prevenuto qualunque disguido facilitando al tempo stesso tale pratica alla S.V.

Section 2 a Registration No.3243 ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW OFFICES

Alexandria, July 14th, 1870

Following the opening of the navigation lines of the "Khedivial Mail Lines" on the coast of European Turkey and Syria, this General Management beg to inform you of the Seaports where there are Post Offices,

pointing out those which deal with registered letters:

Offices for ordinary mail only:

Sira, Lagos, Tenedos, Mettelino, Mersina, Cavala, Scio, Tripoli, Latakia, Gallipoli.

Offices dealing with registered letters:

Cospoli, Jaffa, Dardanelli, Alessandretta, Smirne, Salonicco, Beyrut, Volo.

By making this distinction we hope we have avoided every doubt and question, and have, in the meantime, facilitated your work.

While the Foreign Post Offices in Turkey in general were opened as much from a business— as from a diplomatic point of view, the Egyptian offices had a purely business character. Probably in view of the low revenue derived from the office at Jaffa, that office was closed down on 15th February 1872. The relative Post Circular reads(3):

Alessandria, 15 Febbraio 1872.

Dall'Amministrazione dei vapori postali della Khedivie viene significato a questa Direzione Generale la sospensione della navigazione per le due linee della Soria e Tessaglia cioé a dire pei luoghi al margine citati. Egli è perciò che da oggi in poi la S.V. non accetterà più numerario pei detti scali, ma riceverà soltanto le corrispondenze attenendosi per la tassa alla tariffa della convenzione postale Austro-Egiziana cioè di P.T.2 per ogni porto di grammi 15.

In quanto alle partenze dei vapori austriaci per le dette località esse avvengono ogni 15 giorni a contare dal giorno 22 corrente alle ore 2 p.m.

Si avverte però la S.V.che resta in attività la linea di Constantinopoli ma colle seguenti modificazioni cioè: da Alessandria per Sira, Scio, Smirne, Metelino, Dardanelli, Gallipoli, Constantinopoli e viceversa (linea indiretta) partiranno ogni 15 giorni a cominciare da Giovedi' 22 Febbraio 1872.

Da Alessandria per Smirne, Dardanelli, Cospoli e viceversa (linea diretta) le partenze sono del pari quindicinali a cominciare da Giovedi' 29 corrente e perciò interpolarmente arrà luogo ogni Giovedi' una partenza o del piroscafi diretto o indiretto come sopra detto.

RE:- Interruption of the navigation of the lines Syria - Tessaglia (Jaffa, Beirouth, Tripoli, Lattachia, Alessandretta, Mersina, Volo, Salonicco, Tavola, Porto Lagos.)

Alexandria, February 15th, 1872

We are informed by the Khedivial Mail Lines that navigation will be interrupted on the lines of Syria and Tessaglia, i.e. for the localities mentioned on the margin.

In consequence thereof, as from this date you will accept no more groups for these ports, whilst correspondence only may be acsepted at the ruling rate of the Austro-Egyptian Agreement, i.e.: 2 piastres per 15 grs.

With regard to the departure dates of the Austrian ships bound to the said localities, these will take place fortnightly as from the 22nd instant at 2 p.m.

You are, however, informed that the Constantinopoli lines remain in service, subject to the following alterations: from Alexandria to Sira, Scio, Smirne, Metellino, Dardanelli, Gallipoli, Constantinopoli and vice versa (non direct line) - fortnightly sailings starting as from Thursday, 22nd February 1872.

From Alexandria to Smirne, Dardanelli, Cospoli and vice versa (direct line), departures are also scheduled fortnightly, as from Thursday 29th instant. Thus a departure will take place alternatively every Thursday being either the direct or the non-direct ship, as stated above.

Both above Post Circulars have been found in the Postal Museum Fuad I at Cairo. The dates given in these circulars are confirmed by the dates found on accounts and other documents which were as well discovered at the museum. (4)

The stamps in use at the Egyptian Post Office at Jaffa were those of the 1867 issue of Egypt. Although only the 1 pi stamp is mentioned by the Study Circle of Egypt, it must be presumed that several if not all denominations of that issue were actually sold at Jaffa.

The Egyptian Post Office at Jaffa was opened and closed before the formation of the Universal Postal Union. The postage rates were probably similar to those used at other Egyptian Post Offices in Turkey. It is necessary however to mention that because of lack of proper documentation the rates in use were not definitely established, not to speak about rates in use at Jaffa Post Office, for which no covers have been so far discovered. A document, found at the museum Fuad I sheds some light on the matter. its text is as follows: (5)

AVISO

Il porto marittimo delle corrispondenze che scambiano tra Suez-Gedda, e tra Constantinopoli e Alessandria è fissato a P.E.1 per lettere ordinarie, a para 5 per le stampe e giornali ed a P.E.1 per i campioni.

Le corrispondenze da Constantinopoli e Gedda per l'interno dell'Egitto e vice-versa pagheranno oltre il porto marittimo la tassa territoriale interna attualmente in uso.

Per le lettere raccomandate si pagherà oltre la tassa di affrancazione un diritto fisso di P.E.2.

L'affrancazione delle lettere, giornali, stampe e campioni è obligatoria.

La partenza dei vapori da Alessandria per Constantinopoli ha luogo ogni martedi' ad ore 3 p.m., e da Suez per Gedda ogni Giovedi' ad ore 9 a.m.approssimativamente.

VICE ROYAL POSTAL ADMINISTRATION Postal Fees for Constantinople and Djedda.

NOTICE

Sea transport postal fees between Suez-Djedda and Constantinople-Alexandria are as follows: P.E.1 for ordinary letters, 5 paras for printed matter and newspapers and P.E.1 for samples.

The mail from Constantinople and Djedda to and from the inland country in Egypt will be charged in addition to the sea transport postal fees - the territorial tax actually in force.

For registered letters, P.E.2 will be charged in addition to the postal fee.

Prepayment of postage for letters, newspapers, printed matter and samples, is compulsory. Sailings from Alexandria to Constantinople will take place every Tuesday at 3 p.m. and from Suez to Djedda every Thursday at about 9 a.m.

In addition some reference must be made to the only one postmark used at that time at the Jaffa Post Office.

Its illustration is given below:



Further there is known also to be an Interpostal Seal Jaffa in deep blue colour.

The fact that neither covers nor stamps off cover are known, gives the above article more or less a theoretical character; and

there seems to be almost no hope that more than known at present will come to light in future.
