




FIG 1a: A First Day cover from Jerusalem of S.G.1, the first stamp issued for use in the then British occupied part of the country. (10.2.1918).



FIG 1b: "UNDOF AUSBATT 1500" postmark and units' handstamps of the Austrian force in the Golan Heights.




FIG 2a: A rare cover from besieged Jerusalem to Cyprus (1948) (Art. 2/18).

The postmark: Jaffa Syrie 28 Oct. 98.




FIG 3a: Civilian mail pre-paid cover, from Rishon le Zion to Cairo, postmarked at APO SZ 32 on 5 July 1918 - latest date known. (Art. 3/83).




FIG 4a: Registered letter of the Austrian Force in the Golan Heights.




FIG 5a: The extremely rare Turkish Mahane Yehuda postmark ("Suc. Poste Mahna Juda/Jerusalem") shown on a cover, later registered and postmarked "Jerusalem I" in the main Turkish Post Office.





FIG 5b: A registered letter from the very short-lived Talavera Barracks post office in Jerusalem (later called Mahane Allenby) operating during July-December, 1936.

which served as the municipality, post office and water tower of the town. (Art. 6/266).*




FIG 6b: The new automatic sorting center in Tel Aviv.




FIG 7a: The earliest cover known from Jerusalem, after the British occupation in World War I. (Art. 7/303).




FIG 7b: A cover from England to Palestine, taxed by the Austrian Post in Jaffa by an Austrian Levant postage due stamp.




FIG 8a: An Air Mail letter “from a soldier”, through “Menorah” Club, from besieged Jerusalem to Tel Aviv. (Art. 8/362)




FIG 10a: “Forwarded Letter” from Jerusalem, marked “By the good services of Mons. Nicolas Reggio of Marseille on June 4, 1843”. (Art. 10/503)




FIG 10b: A postcard with the First Day postmark of the German post office in Jaffa. (Art. 10/505)




FIG 11a: The German Post Office in Jaffa street, Jerusalem, in the beginning of the 20th century.




FIG 11b: A registered letter originating from Ramleh Postal Agency and dispatched by the German Post Office in Jaffa. (Art. 11/542)




FIG 12b: The Austrian Post Office and mail carriage in the Old City of Jerusalem near Jaffa Gate, ca. 1914. (Art. 12/599).




FIG 13-14a: “An official note from Petach Tikwa postal agency to Dr. A. Ruppин, with the extremely rare Hebrew postmark “Do’ar * Petach Tikwa Eretz-Israel” of 8th March, 1914.



FIG 13-14b: The Souvenir Sheet for Israel 35 years of Independence, designed by Y. Agam.




FIG 15a: Rare cover from Suez to Jerusalem, carried by the airship Graf Zeppelin in its "Egypt Flight" of 1931. (Art. 15/735)




FIG 15b: The Souvenir Sheet for the National Stamp Exhibition "Tel Aviv 83".




FIG 16a: Unrecorded negative seal of a Jerusalem Ottoman Branch Post Office. (Art. 16/809)

FIG 17-18a: The cancelling device of “Menchie (Jaffa)” and the unique postcard with this postmark. (Art. 17/881)




FIG 17-18b: A rare crash-cover, salvaged from an accident of a “LOT” flight from Tel Aviv to Warsaw over the Pirine Mountains in November 1937.




FIG 19a: A rare registered cover from Mea Shearim BPO of the British Military Administration. Dispatch postmark "Jerusalem 1" of 20.3.1920 and the arrival "Jerusalem RLO 24 Sp 20", after letter was returned.




FIG 19b: Do'ar Ivri stamps overprinted "T" (Haifa Provisional Postage Due), used for taxing a letter, franked by a then demonetized Mandate stamp, on 24 May, 1948.




FIG 20a: A postcard from the Austrian Postal Agency in Colony Hadera, with surtax of a 1913 Local Stamp "ה מושבה חדרה ה" with ornamental frame - hitherto unrecorded variety. (Art. 20/1010)




FIG 20b: A rare letter with mixed franking and "Min'helet Ha'am" postmarks, flown to Rome, probably on the first mail carrying flight of the Czechoslovakian Airlines on May 26th, 1948. (Art. 20/1023)




FIG 21-22a: The Souvenir Sheets for the World Stamp Exhibition ISRAPHIL 85 - Tel Aviv 14-22 May 1985.




FIG 21-22b: An almost unique Ottoman postmark of the village Samakh on a cover from Turkey to Beersheba. (Art. 21-22/61).




FIG 23-24a: The artist design (Eva Samuel) of the Rishon LeZion Armored Car stamp of 1948.




FIG 23-24b: A registered Minhelet Ha'am letter from Yokneam with a handwritten registration label. (Art. 23-24/128)




FIG 25-26a: A letter from Paris to Kibbutz Ma'abarot, forwarded by the Jewish National Fund courier in Geneva and the Czechoslovakian Airlines, towards the end of May. 1948. (Art. 25-26/167).




FIG 25-26b: Telegram from Mr. Taussig, CSR Palestine representative, working to keep air communications open after the British turned Lydda Airport over to the Arabs. (Art. 25-26/167).




FIG 27b: A letter written in 1896 by Mr. Honig to the Rabbis of 'Kollel Minsk', stamped with the trilingual postmark of the Turkish post office in the Jewish Quarter of Jerusalem. (Art. 27/219).




FIG 29-30a: A return cover from Tel Aviv to Paris, May-August 1948, through the airmail service of PELTOURS, via Louis Tourist Agency in Cyprus. (Art. 29-30/439).




FIG 29-30b: A cover from Teheran, 5.5.48, to Tel Aviv carried by the PELTOURS company via Louis Tourist Agency in Cyprus (Art. 29-30/439)




FIG 31a: A First Flight PEDI cover, sent from Brooklyn to Jerusalem on 21 May 1948. (Art. 31/527).




FIG 31b: A telegram from the Israeli Postmaster General to his USA colleague, informing the arrival of the first PEDI mail on 3 June 1948. (Art. 31/527).




FIG 32a: The 10th Anniversary issue.




FIG 32b: An intermediate design by the artist A. Berg for the stamp of Nazareth Basilica of the Annunciation. (Art. 32/670).




FIG 35a: Prepaid postcard from Rehovot, franked and cancelled at Ramleh, A.P.O. SZ 18. Rare combination of "Palestine Censorship" with letter N. in a circle. (Art. 35/819).




FIG 35b: Flown cover from besieged Jerusalem to Tel Aviv, with the provisional army postmark "Misrad 5" with a date error (?) - 15 July instead of 15 June, 1948. (Art. 35/844).




FIG 36a: Registered letter from Mahne Yehuda B.P.O. at the end of the Interim Period, 30.7.48, with the Mandate postmarks of this Office and of Mea Shearim Office, which were used for a few days only. (Art. 36/906, 924).




FIG 37-38a: Cover from the German air-company "Feld-Flieger Abt. 300 Pascha" of the German Military Mission associated with the Turkish army in WWI, postmarked by "Feldpost Mil. Miss. Bir-Es-Seba". (Art. 37/973).




FIG 37-38b: A Safed postcard, sent in 1916 from the Turkish post office in Tiberias, handstamped "T" and taxed with another 20 pa. stamp.




FIG 40a: The English version of the illustrated greeting telegram, used in Palestine during the Mandate period. (Art. 40/1091).




FIG 40b: Assortment of regular Israeli postmarks, used since 1948. (Art. 40/1174).

FIG 41-42b: Registered Mea Shearim (Jerusalem) cover to Frankfurt, 1916. Handstamped “R” registration and number in manuscript..




FIG 43a: A 1420 pre-stamp letter from Crete to Alexandria, which was probably sent via Haifa.(Art. 43/67).




FIG 43b: The first essays for the Nahariya Emergency Post (1948), submitted by a Haifa designer. (Art.43/88).




FIG 44a: A rare private-drop letter to Vienna from the 1929 Orientfahrt of the Graf Zeppelin.(Art. 44/133).



FIG 44b: An IL 1.20 International Reply Coupon of 1972, one of the rarest in Israel, which was probably not issued for sale. (Art.44/162).




FIG 45-46a: A rare *Minhelet Ha'am* cover sent from Haifa to New York in the beginning of May, 1948. Reaching its destination on 17 June, it was taxed there with US postage due stamp for insufficient franking. (Art. 45/216).






FIG 45-46b: A telegram from the Hagana Quartermaster to 'Boaz', informing that "The Military Mail will begin to function as of May 20". (Art. 45/245).






FIG 48a: A rare registered cover of the “Egyptian Occupation Post” in beer Sheva, from September 1948. The stamps are Egyptian stamps overprinted PALESTINE. (Art. 48/369).




FIG 49-50b: A “double” courier letter from besieged Sdom to Tel Aviv, via Jerusalem. Dispatched to Jerusalem by airplane and franked there by “Jerusalem stamp”. Then to Tel Aviv by courier, where it was postmarked on July 27, 1948 and delivered. (Art. 49/466).




FIG 51a: An essay of a postcard with the 1901 imprinted stamp design of the Italian Post in Jerusalem, with the overprint "Gerusalemme 20 Para". The actually issued card was imprinted with the Leoni stamp design of 1906. (Art. 51/511).




FIG 51b: A 1906 registered insured courier letter from Safed via Beirut to Bucharest. The letter, which contained a large sum of money, was franked in Beirut with Austrian Levant stamps of fantastic total value of 741/4 piastres, most of the stamps being tied to the reverse. (Art. 51/562).




FIG 52a: A 1912 postcard delivered by the “postal service” of Herzlia Gymnasium students in Jaffa (Tel Aviv), that operated in the High Holidays of 1912-1914. It is franked by a J.N.F. Label, cancelled by the students’ Herzl Club handstamp. (Art. 52/645).




FIG 55a: A unique doubly taxed cover from N.Y. to Jerusalem. Underfranked 3 cents, it was taxed by the French P.O. in Jerusalem with two French P.D.'s, but being refused by the recipient it was returned to the sender where the N.Y. Post Office tried to collect the tax by two U.S. Postage Dues. (Art. 55/764).




FIG 55b: A very rare cover with the Nahariya emergency First Slogan, "The Isolated Galilee", from 22 March 1948, with the manuscript hour 22.00 instead of the usual 11.00. (Art. 55/795).




FIG 56a: A registered cover from the Austrian postal agency in Rishon Lezion, sent to Germany in June, 1903. On the front appear the circular handstamp (with Magen-David) of the agency and an unrecorded straight-line cachet of the manager Medalia: "MEDALIA RISCHON L'ZION". (Art. 56/831).




FIG 56b: Interim use of postal material - Mandatory official envelope and registry label used by the Metulla Minhelet Ha'am post office on 11 May, 1948. (Art. 56/882).




FIG 57-58b: A commercial cover franked by the three Doar Ivri high values, from the Hebrew University (11 July 1948) to Princeton University, N.J., cancelled by the Mea Shearim Minhelet Ha'am postmark. Is it really the “Large” postmark? (Art. 57/943).




FIG 60b: A letter of apology from the Jerusalem Postmaster for a letter sent in error from England to Jordanian Jerusalem. (Art. 60/1088).




FIG 61-62a: A telegram from the Emergency Committee to David Ben-Gurion congratulating him on the “opening of the first Hebrew postal service in Jerusalem”. (Art. 61/14).




FIG 61-62b: A Jerusalem picture postcard in use by the Howard's Hotel, with a miniature of the hotel and its cachet. (Art. 61/3).




FIG 64b: Public Notice #12/95, announcing the initiation of postal service (airmail) Israel-Jordan, The insert shows a postcard from Madaba, Jordan, to Israel sent on the first day, 6.2.95. (Art. 63/71).




FIG 65-66a: An imprinted Ottoman postcard (20 para), with additional two Beni Saab provisionals (overprint 5 on 10 p.) paying the "War Tax", which was sent in February, 1918 to Istanbul. It was cancelled by a Turkish "Field Post Office No. 46" postmark of the Turkish unit stationed then in Beni Saab. (Art. 65/199).




FIG 65-66b: A picture postcard sent on 3.3.18 from Hebron to Jerusalem, with the Hebron pre-payment oval cachet filled in "1/2 PE". A 5 mil stamp (#4) was later affixed in Jerusalem and cancelled "APO SZ44 / 6 MR 18". (Art. 65/165).




FIG 67-68a: The “new” Austrian Post Office in the Old City, opposite The Citadel.




FIG 67-68b: A commercial letter of the Tiberias “Emergency Mail”; with Minhelet Ha’am cancellation indicating that it was mailed after May 2nd, 1948. (Art. 67/215).




FIG 69-72a: 1840 cover from the Jaffa French Consulate to that in Beyrouth, with the hitherto unrecorded extremely rare Danube Steam Navigation Company Jaffa Agency postmark ("D.D.S.G. / JAFFA"). Insert: Reconstruction of the postmark. (Art. 69/332).





FIG 69-72b: Cover sent from Jerusalem to New York by a member of UNSCOP (United Nations Special Committee On Palestine). The recommendations of this Committee had an important roll in the UN November resolution on the establishment of the State of Israel. (Art. 69/325).

of Eretz-Israel.*




FIG 73-74b: A very rare registered letter from the Egyptian Occupation Post in Faluga from the time of the War of Liberation, June 1948. (Art. 73/399).




FIG 75a: An 1838 folded letter from Rabbi Joseph Schwarz to his brother in Germany, bearing the earliest known Jerusalem postmark (in Hebrew, Arabic and Latin) reporting the foundation of a semi-official postal agency of the Jewish community in Jerusalem. Art. (75/ 529&533).




FIG 77-78a: Israeli P.O.W. postcard from Lebanon, 27.2.49, from the War of Liberation. The postcard was carried by the Red Cross organisation, as most of the P.O.W. mail, and it is one of the rarest P.O.W.'s mail items of the War of Liberation. (Art. 77/629).




FIG 79-80b: A registered postcard from the Beersheba Ottoman post, sent during W.W.I (April, 1916) - an extremely rare postal item! (Art. 79/693).




FIG 81-82a: A 10 para stamp of the Turkish 1914 Issue overprinted in red, "Abrogation of the Capitulation 1330" on a prestamped postcard from Jerusalem to England, sent on Oct. 26, 1914. Extremely rare as used in the Holy Land. (Art. 81/2).




FIG 81-82b: Ottoman Postal Money Order for 55 Grush (Registration No. 078575) sent from Bir-El-Sebee on February 23, 1914 to Jerusalem. (Art. 81/63).




FIG 83a: One of the few covers believed to have been brought from the Old City Jewish Quarter in May 1948, and which was then delivered by the Minhelet Ha'am post. At first it was cancelled in the Jewish Quarter, with the Abulafia "Rubber Wall Postmark". (Art. 83/128).




FIG 84b: A prestamped Ottoman cover from W.W.I from the Turkish military camp in Halsa (then an important crossroads 20 km south-west from Beer Sheba) to Istanbul with the extremely rare Halsa negative seal (only 3 reported) of June 1917. (Art. 83/110).




FIG 85-86a: Letter from the winegrowers "Carmel Oriental" from Zichron Jacob dispatched per Austrian post via Haifa to Alexandria, on 14 September 1913. (Art. 85/166).




FIG 85-86b: Registered French Post Office cover sent from Haifa to Beirut (and returned) in August 1913; franked with French "Levant" stamps surcharged "1 Piastre" each. (Art. 85/207).




FIG 87a: Unique postcard from 1909/1910 cancelled by the newly discovered Jerusalem Agency cachet JERUSALEM/SUC. POSTE GRAND NEW HOTEL addressed to the USA with a 20 para stamp of the 1909 issue. The postmark here has been retouched to ensure a clear illustration. (Art. 87/295).




FIG 88b: The origin of the Israeli Post Running Stag emblem: The shoulder tag of the Israeli Army Post unit in 1948. (Art. 87/302).




FIG 90b: A reply envelope of a "Schnorrer Briewe" from Jerusalem from the beginning of WWII. Backstamped on arrival by the rare machine cancellation with the slogan. "Passed by Censor / Jerusalem".(Art. 89/383).




FIG 91a: Picture side of an October 31, 1898 (mailed on November 3) Jerusalem to Amberg souvenir card commemorating Kaiser Friedrich Wilhelm Albrecht von Hohenzollern, the Emperor of Germany, trip to the Holy Land.




FIG 93a: One of the earliest recorded official letters from Jerusalem, carried by the courier service which operated between Jerusaelm and Beirut from 1845. (Art. 93/474).




FIG 94b: The Venetian post - Folded letter from Acre (dated March 24, 1471) via Beirut and to Venice by galley ship. (Art. 93/474).




FIG 97a: The use of Printed Matter stamp in Ottoman Palestine was very rare (1895-1898) This cover from Jerusalem Old City Jewish Quarter to Safad has such a stamp (The 10 para 1892, overprinted "Matbu'a"), It is extremely rare - only 3 such covers have been recorded. It is cancelled by the Jewish Quarter's postmark, which includes the name "ירושלים" in Hebrew (Photocopy courtesy Z. Alexander).




FIG 98b: A cover, exploded for demonstration, showing the earliest date (24.8.48) that a local "Jerusalem Stamp" was not considered valid in Jerusalem and therefore taxed (double) the proper rate by 6 Doar Ivri P.D. stamps (Courtesy Dr. Eddie Leibu).



FIG 99a: The Swiss issued "Souvenir de Bethlehem" Last Christmas of the XIX Century card. (Art. 99/719).




FIG 100b: Letter from Derby, England (1.11.1854), carried by the Paquebot "Lycurge", via Marseille, Smyrna, Beirut, and Jaffa (transit French single-line "Jaffa") to Jerusalem (30.11.1854). Franked 1/3 shilling by 1/- embossed. 1 p and 2 p engraved issues of 1854, it has the record of being the earliest known incoming mail to the Holy Land, franked by postage stamps. (Art. 99/748).

Introduction

This is a combination of the first four **Indexes** (for Volumes I - IV respectively), and a new **Index** - for Issues 81-100, compiled recently (but not published). It has been combined now with the previous ones to produce a **Full Index** for issues 1- 100 (Vols. I – V) which is published herewith.

“It is a privilege to quote here the pioneer composer of this Society **INDEX to HLPH VOLUME 1**, Eddy Leibu, back in 1984 :

“It is always a problem to choose the most adequate method for the layout of an index to a specific publication and there are pros and cons to each method. The present Index has come out as a result of a compromise between several approaches and after useful discussions with my colleagues in the Editorial Board of our Bulletin.

Our subject having a clearcut division into three almost exclusive periods, it has been decided to subdivide the Subject Index into three parts: the “Ottoman Period”, the “Mandate Period” and the “Transition and Israel” period. The entries in each of these parts are separately arranged alphabetically. Nevertheless there are a few cases in which a certain reference belongs to two of the above periods, at least as far as research and collecting interests are concerned; we have endeavoured to include such references in both of the related Index parts”.

Some conventions and notations used in the **Index** :

References are cited by issue number and page of the relevant article or note, e.g. 12/651 means Issue No. 12, p. 651. Major references for a certain entry, i.e. references in which the subject is dealt with extensively, are underlined.

The following table enables the user to relate #Nos. to range of pages and date of the Issues and Volumes of the Bulletin. The System of numbering the Bulletin is so – there are 4 issues per year, some are single-issues, e.g. #7, some double-issues, e.g. #13-14 etc. Thus physically one year may have less than 4 brochures, e.g. in 1984 were published 4 issues (# 17-18,19,20) in 3 brochures. Every 5 years therefore produced 20 issues which were defined as a **Volume**. The pages are numbered cumulatively in each Volume, but start from 1 in each new Volume.


